

Host Homes Information Sheet
Kiev Symphony Orchestra and Chorus
Sept. 20, 21 & 22, 2008

Opening your heart and home to members of the Kiev Symphony Orchestra and Chorus makes this American tour possible. Your gracious gift of hospitality will undoubtedly prove to be a memorable experience for all. Below you will find the current itinerary and a brief outline of Music Mission Kiev transportation and meal needs to be provided by our host families. *(Note: Times are approximate. Confirmation of times and instructions will be sent to you later. In the event our guests arrive earlier in the day, this order of activity will change.)*

- Your guest(s) will arrive at Glenkirk **Saturday, September 20**, in the morning. After a rehearsal and lunch, host families will greet and pick up their assigned guests.
- Guests will rest and be returned to Glenkirk at their call time before the Saturday service. Host families will provide supper after the service.
- On **Sunday, September 21**, host family will provide light breakfast.
- Guests will be taken to Glenkirk at their call time before Sunday morning services.
- MMK Guests will join the Glenkirk choir for lunch at Glenkirk.
- Host families will pick up their assigned guests after lunch and take them home to rest.
- Guests will be returned to Glenkirk at their call time before the afternoon concert.
- Enjoy the concert at 4:30 p.m. Get your tickets on the patio beginning May 18 or in the church office.
- Substantial appetizers will be served on the patio after the concert for all who attend.
- Host families will take guests home.
- On **Monday, September 22**, host family will provide breakfast and a sack lunch and drop your guests off at Glenkirk in the morning.
- Host family will pick up guests at Glenkirk between 5 & 6 p.m. and provide dinner.
- On **Tuesday, September 23**, host family will provide breakfast and a sack lunch and drop off guests at Glenkirk (or another alternate location in Glendora, if necessary).

As you consider how you can best accommodate our Ukrainian guests, keep in mind that most of them live in very small quarters at home. A single bed or comfortable couch is certainly acceptable. Private bathrooms are not necessary. Your warmth and caring are what will be remembered long after the group's return to Kiev; however should you take four Ukrainians, you must have at least two full bathrooms in order to facilitate arriving on time for a concert or their departure.
