THE BIG IDEA

Scarcity causes us to become desperate. However, abundance starts with what we have. And when we give God what we have, God ensures that it is enough to do all that God wants us to do.

OPENING

- A scarcity mindset views the world as a finite set of resources, so people must compete against each other for their share of those resources. Describe an example you've seen of a scarcity mindset.
- An abundance mindset sees limitless potential in the world. Rather than competing
 for a limited share of resources, an abundance mindset collaborates. Describe an
 example you've seen of an abundance mindset.

DIGGING DEEPER

- Read 1 Kings 17:8-16. How is this miracle performed here by Elijah similar to the one performed by Elisha in 2 Kings 4:1-7? How is it different?
- Bible scholar John Olley says, "In this cameo of seven verses we see how the prophet 'elicits faith and action by questions, encouragement and word'. His compassion foreshadows the approach of Jesus Christ and provides a continuing model for Christian response to human need. The prophet is neither imperious nor paternalistic. He does not produce gold from somewhere else, even if he could, but respects the widow's integrity and dignity. She may start with the smallest possible contribution, but she is an active participant in the solution and is not overshadowed by Elisha." Why is it important that the widow be part of the solution to her plight?
